BSA OUTDOOR ETHICS

Leave No Trace Trainer Course November 17th – 19th, 2017

Your Invited to what we know will be an exciting and worthwhile educational opportunity. The Boy Scouts of America, and the *Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics*, are excited to see you become a *Leave No Trace Trainer*.

When – November 17th 6:00pm – November 19th 6:00pm, 2017. If the start time is a challenge for you, please contact the instructor listed at the bottom of the page, to see if arrangements can be made for you to arrive when your life permits. All 16 hours of course material coverage is required for graduation.

Where – **Falley Scout Reservation**, 8602 Kingman Road, Oskaloosa, Kansas, 66066, the GPS coordinates are N39° 12.0817' W95° 24.2550' at the entrance for the camp. Who – **This course is open to everyone.** It is designed to appeal to not just adults but youth scouts as well. While the course is sponsored by scouting those in fields outside of scouting such as Girl Scouts, 4H, outdoor equipment sales, or manufacturing, land management, and so on are welcome, and invited to attend as well.

Why & What is it – Outdoor Ethics is second only to Safety/First Aid in Scouting's priority list; it is ranked as a higher priority than advancement in scouting. The Leave No Trace Trainer Course is shortened weekend version of the weeklong master educator course. It provides outdoor, hands on, experiential learning in a camping environment. Cost/Registration – **\$3.00, & Registration Closes November 16th, 2017.** This covers registration only. You need to bring your own food, and purchase your own awards. Optionally you can pay an additional \$20.00 and we will cover your food, and or for an additional \$7.00 we will provide your BSA awards. Registration which is limited to the first 20 participants, closes November 16th 11:59pm, 2017 at <http://www.jayhawkcouncil.org/Event.aspx?id=2780> . Registration is done on a first come first serve basis, so register sooner than later. Additional materials, and memorabilia packages are available for an additional cost.

What you need to bring – **Yourself, your personal gear/stuff/paperwork.** Your clothing, hygiene, camping, and cooking gear (while the food is provided you will be responsible for preparing it), your teaching activity/learning exercise ready to go, something to take notes with is recommended if you desire, and required paperwork (health form, Leave No Trace risk waiver, etc.).

Upon successful completion, of the *Leave No Trace Trainer Course* each participant will qualify as a *Leave No Trace Trainer*. Those who successfully complete the course will be able to:

- Understand, demonstrate, and teach minimum impact ethics, and techniques to troops, packs, crews, sponsoring organizations, and other community groups.
- Lead a discussion on outdoor ethics, and help others explore and possibly help guide them toward raising their own personal outdoor ethical standards.
- Conduct *Outdoor Ethics* Awareness Workshops (Leave No Trace 101, and others).
- Participate in District and Council Activities and other events where the *BSA Outdoor Ethics Program (the Outdoor Code, Leave No Trace, Tread Lightly, and the Land Ethic)* can be a useful tool in educating Scouts, Leaders, and others about the need for developing an ever increasing personal outdoor ethic.
- Serve as Youth Trainers in a Troop and be better qualified, and better prepared to handle the Eagle Rank qualifying, Position of Responsibility in a Troop known as “Outdoor Ethics Guide”.
- Serve as a qualified Merit Badge Counselor for one of the ever increasing list of merit badges that include Leave No Trace as one of the requirements.

BSA Outdoor Ethics Overview

BSA’s Outdoor Ethics program is comprised of;

The Outdoor Code, the Land Ethic, Leave No Trace, and Tread Lightly!

Leave No Trace (and Tread Lightly) is an educational organization endorsed by the Army Corps of Engineers, National Parks Service, United States Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Boy Scouts of America. One of the primary goals of Leave No Trace is to train Master Educators, and Trainers who can help teach low-impact outdoor ethics, and skills to the general public, Scout Troops, Cub Packs, Venture Crews, and other community organizations.



The Leave No Trace Trainer Courses’ Value



The Leave No Trace Trainer Course is a vital component of the worldwide Leave No Trace program, and the BSA program. It is a shortened version of the week-long Leave No Trace Master Educator Course. Participants receive introductory training in Leave No Trace skills, and ethics in a condensed two-day format. The Trainer Course assists the student/participant in learning more about the seven principles of Leave No Trace, and techniques for using these low impact skills in both the back country, and front country. It is an essential course for both youth, and adult BSA leaders influencing outdoor activities to enable them to achieve the high standards of ethical behavior set forth by the scouting program. It is also a necessity for those serving in an educational role that involves the outdoors, and or many of the ever growing list of merit badges that have Leave No Trace listed as a requirement. After all Outdoor Ethics is ranked second only to Safety/First Aid on the BSA’s priority list, placing it before advancement. As Outdoor Ethics is part of the foundation of the program. If we build the towers of advancement without the foundation they need, they will not be able to stand the test of life.



These courses are designed for educators, guides, agency employees, Scout Leaders, Scouts, other outdoor professionals, and enthusiast. **Successful graduates of the Trainer Course gain the knowledge, and skills to teach *Outdoor Ethics* information, techniques, and skills.** Participants learn the concepts of *Outdoor Ethics* and should be prepared to teach the *Outdoor Ethics* curriculum in a variety of settings: schools, camps, parks, front country, and wilderness areas. Workshop topics include the underlying ethics, seven principles of Leave No Trace, effective sharing, and teaching styles, such as Authority of the Resource, and how to effectively bring Leave No Trace in to all your activities, as well as what resources are available to provide help.
